Summary of 2005 Season

1st XI: Our first game was a tough one. First up, away at Enfield on 7th May, and everyone contributed to a winning draw. We scored 230-8 off 51 overs with Majid Ali scoring an excellent 71* and Tom Roberts showing potential. Then all the bowlers got a good workout; wickets were spread around with David Fairhead probably the pick of the bowlers with 2-55. However we weren't able to finish them off though we ended up with 4 points as Enfield reached 178-8 from 49 overs.

Our second game saw us start a run during which, bar one match, we became a well-organised unit and which set us up for the season. In an excellent match we defeated Barnes by 8 wickets. Chasing 234-6 declared in 55 overs, we got there with 2 overs to spare thanks to the first of many excellent opening partnerships between Matt Ennion (86*) and Daniel Rodgers (78). This was the first of six League opening partnerships of 100 or more.

North Middlesex were our next visitors to Meadvale Rd and were comprehensively sent packing after being bowled out for 147. A mature 53* from the talented Majed Ali saw us through to victory.

I feel our best and most clinical display in all areas came in the win at Shepherd's Bush. Dismissing them for 72 in 37.4 overs with some fantastic seam bowling from Naz Ali (5-30) and the unlucky D. Fairhead (3-28) being backed up by some great catching. We then knocked them off in just 9 overs with D. Rodgers scoring a rapid 50*.

Our only defeat came at home in a disappointing performance against Uxbridge and we showed a lack of discipline in all areas of the game. We struggled to reach 202-9 dec after 54 overs, partly due to Uxbridge's very negative tactics and largely thanks to Gary Dattani (60*) and James Sprackling's entertaining 29. In reply we bowled without discipline and Uxbridge cruised to a 6 wicket win in 41.1 overs.

We returned to our winning and dominant ways at Hornsey on the hottest day of the year. Despite their disappointing facilities, (the result of vandalism) and being asked to bat first, another century opening partnership from D. Rodgers (65) & M. Ennion (36), backed up by Keith Dutch (77) and Damon Rowan (61*), allowed us to declare after 48 overs on 263-3. Another good team effort in the field, the golden arm of Yogesh Prabhu and K. Dutch's 4-22 brought us the win late in a fiercely competitive game with Hornsey dismissed for 144! We continued our good form against Southgate at home, dismissing them for 167 with Naz Ali taking 4-59, to win by 4 wickets after some nervous overs, with K. Dutch scoring 70 to help to secure victory.

Next up, we won a hard fought, high scoring game away against Barclays, who were eventually to finish bottom of the division. After dismissing them for 235, with K. Dutch 'stealing' 6-65, we eventually won a tough battle with 3.4 overs to spare. M. Ennion produced another peach of a hundred, along with D. Rodgers (70) to see us home. This took us up to 65 points halfway through the season, setting us up nicely for promotion back to the Premier League.

We gained a winning draw at home to Enfield, whilst the Captain was away. Another century opening partnership between D. Rodgers (124) and M. Ennion saw us to 258-4 in 49 overs. Enfield's reply started well but their middle order was ripped apart by Naz Ali (7-66) and they ended up 75 runs short 9 wickets down.

Our next match, away at Barnes saw some slip in our discipline, with only 4 players there for the official start time. We won the toss, misread the wicket and put Barnes into bat. On a small ground they made 213 A.O., with K. Dutch (6-53) our main wicket taker. In reply on a wearing turning track we reached the target with 2.5 overs to spare. K Dutch (79*) and a momentum changing 50 from G. Dattani meant we continued to lead the table. We then secured 10 points in another high scoring game at home against South Hampstead. Opening for us (instead of the injured D. Rodgers), D. Rowan's 118*, sharing in an opening stand of 198 with M. Ennion (93) allowed us to declare on 274-4 in 46 overs. In reply South Hampstead kept up with the rate but ran out of wickets, finishing 50 short on 224 with still 13 overs left!

Our second blip of the season came at North Middlesex (who were later relegated). Although we had them at 101-8 thanks to Y. Prabhu's 3-33, they battled to 161 all out in 52.1 overs. After heavy rain the wicket then became difficult to bat on and we were then "tortured" by the North Middlesex's old pro to leave us hanging on for a point at 53-8, with Luke Budden (21) top scoring beginning to show good promise.

We then welcomed Shepherd Bush to Brentham and we were looking to return to our winning ways. Another century opening stand between D. Rodgers (78) and M. Ennion (119), supported by Dutch (59) allowed us to declare on 289-4 after 46 overs. In reply Shepherds Bush never went for it and just looked for a point. D. Fairhead then bounced out their middle order to give us an outside chance, with Naz Ali taking 4-84 but we run out of overs as they limped to 215-8 including an entertaining 79 from the Bush's Stewart Sidhu.

We were looking forward to avenging our earlier loss against Uxbridge though after we were asked to bat, Uxbridge began their "boring and

negative" game plan with no slips and 5 men on the boundary. We reached 88 without loss, with D.Rowan and M. Ennion on their way to another century stand before a torrential downpour ended the match.

A win against Hornsey at home next match would probably see us seal our promotion to the Premier league. On an overcast day when the ball swung and batting conditions were difficult, Hornsey won the toss and chose to bat only to be bowled out for 122 with Naz Ali (5-55) the chief destroyer. We easily reached the target for the loss of only 2 wickets with Dutch top scoring with 55*. However, with other results not going as we had wanted, we still needed a point from our penultimate game of the season at Southgate to secure promotion, and a win to make us Champions, whilst Southgate themselves needed a win to beat off Uxbridge's challenge for the last Promotion spot. With only M. Ennion there for the scheduled start things weren't looking great, but we did manage to scrape together 11 players. We then lost the toss, but much to our amazement we were asked to bat! After a testing spell from their opening bowlers we managed to post a score of 281-6 after 60 overs with everybody making contributions and M. Ennion (93) top scoring. Southgate needed a win but after a fine opening spell by Suli Mughal (3-44) and then K. Dutch (6-22) cleaning up the tail, they were dismissed for 105 in 28.3 overs. A whole season of hard work and preparation had paid off for everyone.....

BRENTHAM ARE CHAMPIONS!!!!

Our last game of the season was at home to Barclays. After some fine breakfast, courtesy of Mike Avery, this was the start of a bad day for Matthew Ennion, which got worse later (ask Richard & Alison!). However, we batted first to make 264-8 with Luke Budden scoring an excellent 79. Then Naz Ali took his 50th league wicket of the season as Barclays were bowled out 37 runs short. The celebrations started early and I can't remember but I think everybody enjoyed themselves. Overall, 5 of our batsmen featured in the League Batting Averages Top Ten; 4 of them scored over 500 runs each with Matt Ennion (692 runs @57.67) leading the overall aggregate of Brentham players followed by D. Rowan, K Dutch, D. Rodgers and Majid Ali. Two Brentham bowlers were the top two in the League Division top 10 bowling averages, with Naz Ali taking 50 wickets @ 15.72 which was a fantastic achievement and supported by K. Dutch (45 @ 13.40). Attendance at Thursday evening training sessions was good and this played a huge part in our success. Our overseas star Damon Rowan did a great job in running those and in supporting a link to the Colts section, so important to the Clubs' growth.

Lastly, I would like to thank everyone for all their support during the season. It was a fantastic team effort with important contributions from all the 16 players used in the campaign and I thank them all for their commitment. Also special thanks must go to Alison Delaney and Ivor Chaplin; without great people like these, Brentham cricket would simply not exist. Without their organisation I would not be captain.

The 2006 season will bring bigger challenges for all at Brentham, a stronger league with All day cricket. My belief is that long term the Club needs to produce their own from the colts section as well as to remain in the Premier league by attracting players short term to keep strengthening the club. Discipline will need to be at it's highest in all parts of the game this coming season to survive in the top division and we may surprise ourselves and some other teams in the Premier League if we continue to push ourselves. I wish good luck to you all.

2nd XI: Following the highs of the previous year, the 2005 season was one largely of disappointment for the 2nd XI. Having achieved a promotion the main target is always to maintain that status in the higher division the following year. Unfortunately this was a goal that eluded us. With retirements and injury impacting the make-up of the 1st team from last year, as in our previous time in the top division we had weaker availability from the side that had won promotion. Such is the level of opposition that there are no easy games, so unless everyone was on top of their game throughout the season, we knew it was going to be challenging. Just how big the gap is was made evident in our second game of the season against Hampstead, who had finished third from bottom in 2004, where our total of 257 from 54 overs was easily surpassed. Our victory over Southgate was the one notable highpoint, despite the traditional Brentham collapse, with Luke Budden seeing us home in the final over, a knock that justifiably resulted in his promotion to the first team for the rest of the season. Being able to build partnerships as a team throughout our innings and apply pressure through economical bowling without letting batsmen off the hook with “4-balls” are certainly areas that need to be focused on for the coming season. Despite some good performances against Southgate and Richmond, our inability to put together consistent Team performances with both bat and ball detracted from some excellent individual efforts in certain games.

James Bolger and Tom Roberts were centurions for us with excellent unbeaten knocks against Hampstead and Richmond respectively. James topped the averages with 37, with my aggregate total of 389 being the highest. On the bowling side Dillip Thakker led the way with 19 wickets, whilst James Pettifer headed the averages with 29. Mention also to James Martin who bowled some excellent opening spells without any luck other than bad, and Suli Mughal who added extra pace to the attack. David Hall continues to develop despite the frustration of his spells being limited. Thanks to James Bolger and Richard Devine for their assistance in my first year of captaincy, and also to James Pettifer for all his work as Team Sec. in ensuring we were always able to field a full side. The availability of a regular 2nd XI umpire continues to be an area for concern, though it is hopefully one that can be addressed for 2006. Finally I would like to thank all players for their efforts in 2005. Despite results not going our way, the team spirit remained excellent throughout. Here's to a successful 2006 for all our teams.

3rd XI: 2005 was, by and large, a successful season despite finishing a couple of places lower than 2004. The emphasis on youth continued with 18 of the 28 players used being 25 or under. When at our strongest the batting line up was very impressive, but unless our older bowlers were available, the opposition's scoring rate was extremely difficult to control. As I promised the youngsters, on reaching 50 points, I'd give them more responsibility. This was relatively successful and should prove beneficial in their development. Of the regular players the batting honours went to John Magner (335 runs at 56), Tariq Khan (343 runs at 49) and Nishant Patel (450 runs at 35). The only centurion was Khuram Pervez before we lost him to the 2nd XI. The bowling honours went to the ever-green captain (42 wickets at 19). All the youngsters showed their ability at times especially Ashwin Kapoor with his maiden league 50, also Matthew Lowen and Tom Skinner, two 14-year olds with rosy futures. The only down-side was that in 6 of the 18 selected sides we ended up with the disadvantage of only 10 men. This is not the Team Secretary's fault but those in higher sides that cry off far too late. The up-side was when we played the champions elect, Wembley, with 10 men and we beat them! Finally, My thanks to Eddie Rimmer and Andy Pulver for their help on the field.

Summary of 2005 Season - Colts

U17's: Considering we were unable to field an U17 side in 2004, 2005 in my opinion was a success. Last season also saw many colts progressing successfully at senior level. Without doubt those who participated shared a great team spirit. After a promising start with a win at Shepherd's Bush, the Season was topsy-turvy. In the league the U17 players were able to compete and were proud to represent the Club.

This was truly shown by Joe Markowski spearheading this spirit. All those who played had an influence in a game, whether it was Ashwin Kapoor, Andrew Taylor or Sam Jones with the bat and/or Matt Lowen, Joe Markowski and Robert Taylor with the ball. The all-rounders, David Hall, Dihren Gami, Daniel Colgan and Rajev Patel enabled us to field a balanced and competitive side. The U17s also made it to the area final of the Middlesex Cup, but sadly, non-availability perhaps prevented the team from going further. A loss to Ealing in the Final was nothing to be ashamed of, especially as the game went to the wire, the winning runs were scored in the last over with 1 wicket left; the average age of our side was only 15! Noticeable performances in the League were David Hall's 5-20 at Old Actonians and in the same game Ashwin Kapoor scoring 54. Consistent bowling from Matt Lowen and Rajev Patel always keeping batsman guessing with 8 wickets apiece for the season, together with David Hall's 40 against Perivale and Daniel Colgan's 40 also against Perivale earlier in the season. There seems to be a lot of promise for the future of Brentham Cricket Club from these performances. 3 wins, 5 losses and 2 cancellations suggest a very average season statistically; however, many young colts have grown in strength and are proving to be great assets for the Club at senior level. David Hall's leadership always provided interesting and eventful games of cricket and he also merits special mention for his help and support for all the U17 coaching staff. The **U15s** fielded a mainly young U14 team for most of their season. Subsequently, although they were able to bowl well against older opposition, they struggled to post good enough scores, waiting till the end of the season for their first win, against Old Actonians. There were consistent contributions from Jack Cummings with both bat and ball; with runs from Charlie Allum and Tom Skinner, whilst steady straight fast bowling from Matt Harraghy earned him wickets. Their efforts were supported by contributions from Kieren Collins, Matt Lowen, Adam Martin, Usman Jamil, Tom Porter, Sam Howell, Matt Berka & Greg Watson.

The indoor nets, which have been run with the U17s; has seen a large increase in numbers, with most of the team from last year, plus a large number of players coming up from the U13s. The whole squad now looks a lot stronger (bigger and older). We have consistently been asking the U15s to challenge themselves against the U17s indoors. Many have responded, and there has been notable improvement in both application and skills. If this can be carried forward into the outdoor season, and with the added depth and strength, then this can be turned into more results.

Last season a number of U15s played senior cricket and/or U17s, finding that they could compete and contribute. Tom Skinner and Matt Lowen made regular Saturday 3rd league team appearances. Jack Cummings, Charlie Allum and Greg Watson also turned out with a 4th team or Sunday friendlies. The U17s are regularly short due to A-Level pressure. Similar opportunities will no doubt exist this year. Hopefully, more U15's will take advantage of these opportunities. **NIGEL COLGAN**

U13: A solid rather than spectacular season saw the Under 13's to 2nd place in the South Area League and losing finalists in the cup. The majority of runs came from James Hitchcock (118), Tom Brandreth (97), Sam Cato (87), Bhavik Gami (74) and Chris Clarke (66). The leading wicket taker was Chris Clarke with 11 at 7 apiece. Ravi Patel, Sam Cato, Bhavik Gami each took 7 and Aamir Tayeb and Adam Harras-Gummer both took 6. In the recently completed Indoor Winter League, the new crop of Under 13's came equal Second with 3 wins, 1 loss and 1 conceded game, which probably cost us the title.

U11: An average season with 5 wins and 5 losses in Area league and Cup matches. Joe Brandreth took batting honours with 134 runs, and he was supported by Chris Hitchcock, Sahil Patel, Ashwyn Bhanot and Sam Pompilis. Joe, Chris and Sahil were joined by Daniel Harraghy and Arun Patel as the group of leading bowlers. Most of the matches were tightly fought affairs. The game against Acton was won by 1 run with a run-out on the last ball and against Perivale by 1 wicket. Joe's innings of 35 runs against Ealing in a six wicket win was probably the highlight.

U10: Once again the Under 10's were a relatively inexperienced side that included a number of Under 9's in the squad. We played 4 matches in the summer beating Old A's but losing to Ealing (twice) and Perivale. There were good performances with the bat from Daniel Harraghy, Jed Neill and Sam Pompilis. Daniel Harraghy, Jonathan Hooke, Arun Patel and Sam Schindler-Glass took the bowling honours. Every year this job gets harder, with players expecting and wanting more. Well done, Peter!

He's also always at the end of the phone for any cricket questions I have and answers me without making me feel foolish. As usual the Dinner was a great success; the annual Trophies were all awarded, the speakers were excellent, the food great and the company even better. This certainly restricts our spending capacity and makes us more cautious about both normal day-to-day running costs of the Cricket Section and any future purchases of equipment that may be required.

JUNE saw our ground being marked by the Umpires 10 out of 10 (Brentham –v- Barnes), which was a great boost for our new Groundsman, Alan. Here I would like to thank Alan for his hard work and efforts all season; we really do appreciate it. Well done.

AUGUST was a worry for the Colts Section and the spiralling coaching costs as well as the usual mid-Season "dip" in momentum; Chris Healey issued a general reminder for Match Reports for the Web page. A big thank you here to Chris for all his hard work with the Web Page. All this "behind the scenes" stuff that people just don't see as others beaver away relentlessly through the season. Thanks Chris.

In August we also held our **SUMMER BBQ**, which was a roaring success. The 1st XI played against Shepherds Bush at home and we had a nice little ole BBQ. The 2nd & 3rd's came home and we had a great night; shame the weather wasn't a little warmer though we still broke even! Yogesh Prabhu was a "gift" with his staff discount card!

The same couldn't be said for the **BONUS BALL** unfortunately; by now I was seriously worried about having to cancel the Wednesday Bonus Ball Fund Raising Scheme as it was barely breaking even. This despite us pushing hard in asking for people to purchase available 'numbers'.

We also suffered an incident at a 3rd XI game at Vine Lane, though let's not dwell too much on this. Thankfully John Capps dealt with the situation tremendously, with immense consideration for his young team.

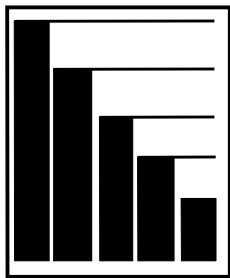

B. J. REID – A TRIBUTE

Brian Reid has been a major presence at Brentham Cricket Club since he joined in 1961. In those 45 years he has not only been an outstanding cricketer but has also served the Club in many positions. One of those roles, namely as President, to which he was appointed in 1998, came to an end following his resignation at the AGM in March 2006. The Club are indebted to him for his leadership in this period, during which he enhanced its standing in wider cricketing circles and ensured that many projects were successfully undertaken thus improving playing conditions. These included amongst others the renovation and electrification of the score-box, and the up-dating of the nets. In all he has served on the Committee for 23 years in addition to the term of his Presidency - a record that few cricketers and certainly outstanding ones can point to. He has for many years taken on the responsibility of the Annual Dinner and it is no surprise that it has remained one of the most successful Dinners amongst our peer clubs. His contribution was recognised on his retirement from playing at the end of the season of 1993 by being appointed a Life Vice President of the Club.

Brian joined the Club at the time that it had one of the strongest sides in its history and quickly became a leading contributor. His statistics in the League (from 1972) are well documented (he is still the leading wicket taker). Overall, however, he played in 1,016 matches for the club and totalled 2,274 wickets at an average of 15 runs per wicket or just under 100 wickets per season for 24 seasons. His best season was 1970 when he amassed 131 wickets, taking 5 wickets on no less than 10 occasions. He took 5 wickets in a match 123 times, whilst his best return was 9 for 19 against Ealing in 1965, when he was one of the quickest bowlers around.

Brian was captain from 1973-75 and 1981-83 and also on Sundays in 1980. He played a major part in the run in 1972 to the Final of the National Cup held at Lords and led the side to the last 16 the following year. He played in the final of the Evening Standard Cup in 1967 but was still a force in the side of 1993, which reached the Quarter Finals of the National Cup. He was capped by the CCC in 1969 and went on their tour to Australia in 1971. Other representative honours were gained with Middlesex 2nd XI, Middlesex County Cricket League, and Middlesex Cricket Union Over 50's, as well as tours with MCC and Buckingham Cavaliers.

There was also his role, which must not be underestimated, as a sponsor. Not only did he sponsor the club but Brian also sponsored MCCL for 1992 –1994, a generosity that has been extremely difficult to replace.

The Club has been outstandingly well served by Brian as Player, Captain, Committeeman, Sponsor, and President. His leadership will be missed but hopefully his presence will not be lost. The Club wishes to express its gratitude to for all that he has done and mark this occasion with this tribute, which inadequately records his contribution in so many aspects of the history and activities of the Club.

We as a Club are also indebted to Harry for 13 years of selfless devotion to the Colts section; in this time he coached and managed the Under 15 side and many of today's younger players owe him a debt of thanks for the way he nurtured and honed their skills.
