There are inevitably uncertainties to be overcome; however with the goodwill currently being demonstrated there is no reason to suppose that this merger should not prove to be beneficial to the parties.

Due to the timing of the Merger, the stipulations of the Middlesex Championship League are such that our 4th and 5th XI will play the 2015 Season identified/named as GWR 1st XI and GWR 2nd XI respectively although being fully integrated into the Club from a Merger perspective.

Summary of 2014 Season

1st XI: After a season of great change in 2013, Brentham 1st XI were hoping that a certain amount of consistency could be achieved during the 2014 season. The same guys who had played in 2013 were back for more and some new recruits were also keen to stake a claim in the side. Importantly, we had also retained the services of Tim Duncraft who returned after a successful season in New Zealand. Over the English winter the boys hadn't remained idle and, under Matt Lowen's guidance, pre-season training (nets, fitness, fielding, personal training, etc) had reached a whole new level. We knew it would be a tough season as the new teams in the division would raise the overall level. I finished last season's report extolling the importance of all players contributing to the team effort, this would be imperative for a successful 2014 season.

We gained three points in our first four games. Two were rained off (Winchmore Hill and Southgate at home), we lost to newly-promoted Indian Gym (Warwick Shanley scoring a maiden 50) and battled to a losing draw at Shepherds Bush thanks to a fine rear-guard action from the lower order, especially Nish Patel (30), before Jaisreet Bajwa and Yogi ('No mans...') Prabhu blunted the last few overs.

The poor weather continued into the following week and despite the groundsman abandoning the next home match (at 9am) we managed to start at 1.30pm! The opposition were freshly-relegated Eastcote. Tim and Matt made the most of the seamer-friendly conditions, picking up all ten wickets between them (Tim: 6 – his maiden 1st XI 5-fer - and Matt: 4). We chased down the target of 102 for the loss of three wickets. It is always important to chase down modest totals in a convincing manner as it sends a message to the rest of the league. Getting a first win of the season out of the way was a satisfying feeling and after a stop-start beginning to the season we felt we could take this momentum on through the rest of the campaign.

Our next fixture, away at Harrow, was the closest league contest I have ever played in. Another wet start to the day meant conditions were seamer friendly. Nevertheless, six of our top seven scored in excess of 15 and none reached 30. As a result we only managed to post 160, after a classic collapse. With Matt and Tim in fine form we knew we could defend this. Matt picked up a couple early on before Yogi came on to change the game. Four quick wickets fell to 'The Cat' and Harrow were rocking on 71-7. Their tail waggled until Vish Sethi convinced one of their batters to have a hack at Jai...bowled. It got down to Harrow being one run behind with one wicket in hand. Their number six swept Jai to deep square leg and turned down a single to take them level! Next ball he tried to repeat the dose, missed and

the umpire raised his finger. A one run win and back-to-back victories. Six games into the season and as a batting unit we had only recorded one fifty between us despite a plethora of 20+ scores. Batting first against Harrow St Mary's would give the boys a good opportunity to pile the runs on. Fortunately, Luke Budden and Matt managed to do just that as they plundered a 172 run partnership. Matt falling for 80 and Luke (scoring his maiden 1st XI century) for 126. Some lower order hitting added the final touch to take us up to 253-8. In reply, Harrow St Mary's got off to a storming start, one of their openers carving fours all around the park. A change of plan was required, enter Jai. First ball their opener chipped the ball to Matt, out surely! Nope! The ball hit the turf and he went on to make 91. Another of their batters finished 88* having been grassed on 0. How true the old cliché: 'catches win matches'. St Mary's finished eight down, we gained four points and maintained our momentum.

Our next game, away at Enfield was abandoned at tea after we had been bowled out for 111, losing our final five wickets for five runs. We were home to top of the table Uxbridge next, a game notable for a fine batting display by Jaz Rehal, scoring his maiden 1st XI hundred. This was a fine reward for Jaz who has shown remarkable progress over the past two seasons. He has always had all the shots and hit a clean ball, but he has now added patience and shot selection to his approach – a dangerous combination. On the back of his knock we scored 245-7 and Uxbridge never attempted to go for it, ending 102-7, patting back the last hour (24 overs of it!). This meant we were half way through the season in a very compressed division, we were looking up and down.

In the following game we had Winchmore Hill in serious trouble (111-8) before their ninth wicket added over 100, one of their guys hitting 80 after being dropped on single figures (déjà vu!). We had 43 overs to chase 213. After a bit of a wobble Matt and Neel Gandhi batted maturely to guide us towards our target, Matt falling short of a deserved 50. If it wasn't for losing four overs to rain we would have chased their total down, as it was we ended 18 runs short. Neel scored his maiden 1st XI fifty and the returning Ravi Patel scored a breezy 33* at the end.

Home to Indian Gym saw the form of Ravi continue as well as Tim make his annual batting contribution. This time it was our turn for a lower order century stand as Tim scored 64* and Ravi 46 showed the top order how to build an innings and bat as a partnership. In a touch and go match, Indian Gym reached the four point target in the final over.

The next two games, Southgate away and Bush at home, followed similar paths: us winning the toss, bowling the oppo out for around 150 and chasing the target three wickets down. Two other consistent factors were Jaz and

Tom Brandreth both scoring the majority of runs (Jaz – two fifties, Tom – a 40 and a 60) and both refusing to see us over the line.

We travelled to Eastcote after a week on tour in Bournemouth (never ideal preparation) and were made to suffer by a resurgent side. They piled on 244-6 in 50 overs and quickly reduced us to 58-6. Ravi and Sahil Patel battled hard and it was left to Ravi and Yogi to try to see out the final 20 overs. The boys almost did it until Ravi was cruelly given out with three overs remaining. At least the boys got to witness Yogi's innovative leaving technique – certainly not textbook, but effective.

Despite the last result we were still in with a slim chance of competing for a promotion spot. Another win against Harrow meant we were safe and right back in the promotion mix. Tim picked up another 5-fer as we dismissed Harrow for 138. Tim's bowling performances, particularly at home, using the Brentham slope, were of a consistently high quality and showed us how much he has developed as a bowler over the year. I'm sure there is still room for improvement in the future (potentially learning to swing the odd ball...). Once again Tom registered another half-century and got out with the finishing line in sight. A quick flurry of wickets could not prevent us winning, Luke finishing on 50*.

Other results continued to go our way, never more so than the following week when we lost to Harrow St Mary's, as did our promotion rivals. We were dismissed in a very soft fashion and they knocked our total off five wickets down.

The penultimate game of the season saw us take on Enfield at home. We recorded 133, thanks to Tom's 31 and a lower order partnership of 36 between Tim and Finn Grist. We pegged Enfield back to 3-3 and 23-6 before finishing them off for 102, Tim again picking up five wickets. Remarkably, this put us in second position with one game remaining – promotion was in our hands.

The first 40 overs couldn't have gone too much better as we had Uxbridge 136-9, Yogi once again revelling at Uxbridge with four wickets. Their last pair batted well and they finished on 172. We never got going with our reply and were eventually bowled out for 94. This resulted in us finishing fourth.

Ultimately, fourth was a resounding success and showed marked improvement on the previous season. In general, players were showing a far greater commitment to training and taking responsibility in matches, there is a more focused and disciplined approach all round (long may it continue). While this may be the case, in terms of performances and affecting the results of matches, the team relied heavily on five/six players. Luke (398), Jaz (390) and Matt (302) all scored over 300 runs; Tom snuck above 200 (in five knocks); no one else scored more than a total of 135.

Tim (36), Matt (33) and Jai (28) all picked up 25+ wickets. Yogi picked up 10 but bowled some important spells. It was pleasing to see Neel and Ravi score some runs, however this needs to be done more consistently, while Finn (at Enfield) and Nish (at Bush) batted bravely. We were equally inconsistent in the field – some days we caught everything, on other occasions dropped catches cost us valuable points.

I cannot finish this report without mentioning the work of one particular individual: Ivor Chaplin. During the season he completed his 700th consecutive League 1st XI match and was justly rewarded by winning an OSCA. This is truly a remarkable achievement and will hopefully inspire many members at the club to replicate the loyalty, dedication and hard work that Ivor has put in over the years.

Personally, I will not be continuing as captain next season, I feel as though I have imparted all I know to the boys in my two years and it would good for them to hear a new voice, with new ideas to help them to learn and develop as cricketers in the future.

LUKE BUDDEN – 1st XI Captain

2nd XI: Brentham second eleven endured another poor season that resulted in a second relegation in as many years. Going into the last game of the season we knew that a victory would see us safe but we lost at home to a strong Enfield side. With the sides below us picking up victories we were relegated by a point. For the first time in 44 years one of Brentham's top 3 league elevens will play outside of the Middlesex County Cricket League, as the 2s will ply their trade in the Middlesex Championship in 2015.

The season didn't start well, we lost our opening day fixture by 5 wickets away at newly promoted Osterley. The following three weeks saw a mixture of performances and results. In week two we 'played all the cricket' at home to North London but couldn't force a victory. Batting first we scored 190 and reduced North London to 90-9 but their last pair clung on for the last 10 overs and we left the game with only 4 points. We played some cricket at Southgate the following week but not enough to constitute a game (1 point each) then lost at home to Bessborough in week 4 with what was probably one of our worst performances of the season. We were bowled out 90 and

our opposition knocked this off with half their wickets still in tack. The following week, away at South Hampstead, the game was very unfortunately very similar. We were bowled out cheaply again and South Hampstead passed our total with ease. Week 6 saw our first win of the season. The leading performer in the early part of the season, Ciaran Brett, again did the damage at home to Wembley. He took four wickets as we bowled Wembley out for 110. Finn Grist (50*) and Graeme Overy (49*) then knocked the total off without us losing a wicket, very un-Brentham like. The next week away at Kenton, none of the bowlers fared well as the home side put a total of 320 on the board. We were never really in the chase and ended up settling for a point. Week 8 and 9 saw us gain 14 points and extend our unbeaten run. Firstly at home to Wycombe House we won a low scoring game, having been bowled out for 122 we managed to defend this when our opponents were knocked over for 98. Yogi Prabhu (5-44) and Ciaran Brett (4-33) both bowled excellently. The last game of the first round of fixtures saw us make the trip to Enfield. Batting first on a typically good wicket Brentham managed their highest total of the season, 248-7 (Daniel Siggers 96* and Fraser Coxhill 51). James Pettifer scored a very useful 36* in an unbroken 8th wicket partnership of 99. Having accused us of being negative, Enfield came out and approached their batting in a strange manner. Having not attacked our bowling at all they ended up 145-5 and Brentham gained the winning draw.

The first game of round two had the same outcome as the first game of the season, we lost comfortably to a strong Osterley side. Strangely our next fixture away at North London was called off early in the morning, even though every other game in the MCCL that day had play. Our next home fixture was against Southgate, we did well as a fielding side to restrict our opponents to 210-9 off their 55 overs (Daniel Siggers 6-60). On a good wicket and with our 'strongest batting line up all year' we were confident of chasing the total, as it turned out we didn't even get half way. James Pettifer and Jamie Mansie showed great courage to bat for 21 overs and see us to 92-9 and secure us a point. Away at Bessborough the following week we batted well as a side and put up a total of 242 – 6 dec in 51 overs (Daniel Siggers 69, Sahil Patel 46*). Unfortunately our performance in the field didn't match the batting and the home side chased down the total with a handful of overs to spare. The following 2 fixtures saw us collect another 14 points, firstly 4 points at home to South Hampstead followed by a win away at Wembley. A fine 51 on second team debut by Chris Hitchcock saw us score 214 at home to South Hampstead, our opponents ended up well short of the winning draw mark. Away at Wembley the following week Chris Hitchcock was again the star performer with 6-40 as we dismissed the

home side for 110. We made things hard for ourselves by losing a wicket first ball of the chase but ultimately managed to get home with 5 wickets in hand. At home to Kenton the following week we only managed to pick up a losing draw. Batting first we did well to get to 221 all out having been 2-2, James Pettifer (40) and Richard Chatterton (31) shared an 8th wicket stand of 83. Week 17 saw us travel to Wycombe House, with the home side below us in the league a victory would have guaranteed our survival. The less said about the game the better. Wycombe House batted first and managed to score 149 all out, in response we were 45-0 but a mixture of poor batting, good spin bowling and terrible umpiring saw us full 30 runs short and settle for a losing draw. As mentioned earlier in this piece, we went into the last game of the season at home to Enfield knowing a win (or match sides below us results) would keep us up. Batting first we managed a below par score of 124. Despite a couple of early wickets we were never really in the hunt and ended up losing by 7 wickets. Other results went against us and we ended up being relegated with a haul of 48 points.

Over the course of the season the second team used 31 different players. Only 4 players ended the season having scored more than 200 league runs - Daniel Sagggers 425 at 31.2; Graeme Overy 235 at 29.3; James Hitchcock and Fraser Coxhill with 211 at 17.5. Of the 13 bowlers that were used during the summer only 3 ended the season with double figure wickets – Ciaran Brett 24 at 18.5, James Pettifer 22 at 26.1 and Chris Hitchcock 10 at 14.8. As always, thanks to John Capps for his umpiring skills. Having an umpire for every league game is a huge bonus.

Ultimately a very disappointing season for the side. Here's hoping that next summer our availabilities are stronger throughout the season and the second team can get their MCCL status back at the first attempt.

SUNDAY – DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE XI:

Results wise it was a very poor season this year as we finished bottom of the pile with 2 points from six games, both of those coming in losing draws against Indian Gymkhana.

Having said that aside from one or two of the games we were very much in all the games and could have won both games against Indian Gymkhana and one of the Ealing games on another day.

There were definite improvements in terms of team selection this year as myself, Tim and James Hitchcock played the majority of games and gave the team some stability in terms of Over 21s.

In terms of the leagues aim which is to give worthwhile cricket to teenagers who wouldn't otherwise have got it, I think there were some definite positives.

Players like Stef Walecki, Jamie Mansi and Chris Hitchcock all got good overs and crease time under their belt in competitive games.

The issues/improvements/discussions I think that need to be had with the league in general and us specifically are:

1 Strength of adults – Indian Gymkhana's three overage players scored 140 out of their 170 and took 7 or 8 of the wickets to fall in the first game. In the second game it was a very similar figure. I know for a fact that all three of them are/were regular 1's players so how is that helping us or them if they are doing that. On balance of side Ealing were the best we played with 2 average overage players and then the rest being 16-19 year olds. Do we look to get better overagers in to improve results or accept we will get a few heavy beatings to make sure that the players get development time? For me the answer is definitely the second option as surely that is the point of the league and if other clubs are hell bent on winning it with older players so be it.

2 Age of our Under 21s – We were still probably on the young side in terms of who we put out in the Under 21s this year but the younger guys did do well when called upon. We have almost a missing generation between 18-21, where we don't have a great number of players so we had a lot of 16-18 year olds in the side this year. Again in the long run I think this will bear fruit because you could see people like Andrew Dickson, David Hooke and others come on during the games and bring that into other Saturday and Sunday cricket.

As a general league this is definitely worth pursuing with but hopefully there will be a couple of tweaks to make it better moving forwards.

UNDER 17

The U17 season was a great success in terms of the increase in the number of games we could get exam-challenged teenagers to play, with 9 sides put together and 7 games actually played. The policy of trying to split games into a few early season and the rest as late as possible seemed to help, as did the relentless personal harassment of players.

However, despite the evident self-confidence of many of the squad, the performances on the field were none too clever (W1 L6). It's not just that we most of our games badly either. Even given the youth of many of our players (we only had 3 or 4 Year 12's most weeks, and had several Year 10's playing), there were far too many batters cleaned up unable to defend, or bowlers unable to control the ball or figure out where to bowl at a given batsman on a given wicket. That's not to say many of our U17/16/15 won't make it into adult cricket - I think we have quite a few who will. But some are leaving it dangerously late to get a clue about their own limitations, or how grown up cricket is played.

U17 training was a casualty of the much-improved attendance at adult training on Thursdays - fairly quickly it became clear there wasn't enough room for both. An attempt was made to switch to Monday evenings, but with little success. This remains an outstanding problem to be solved next year.

P.A.R SWANN – Happy 90th Birthday

Paul Swann is our oldest Life Vice President and on 19th April 2015 celebrates his 90th Birthday. It is due to the continued interest and support received from former players and friends that assists the Club in its progression, as well as giving it added stability and depth. It is, therefore, appropriate that we should remember Paul on reaching his 9th decade but also to recall the part that he played for both the Cricket Club and the main Club. These things are too readily overlooked and lost in the passing of time.

Paul joined in 1946 after service in the Royal Navy. His younger brother John had joined earlier in 1944. He was, like his brother, a left handed batsman and occupied the middle order batting positions in the main. He also quite often kept wicket, which probably followed on from his footballing prowess as he was the goalkeeper for Brentham 1st XI when they were at the highest level in the Southern Amateur League. 1953 proved to be Paul's "annus mirabilis" when he scored over 1,000 runs, a feat very rarely achieved. He was a significant figure in both the Club and the dressing room and provided the "glue" that all teams need to function and be successful. In these years Brentham made giant strides forward and established the base from which it operates today. He was always known as a real gentleman and provided great encouragement to the youngsters. He retired too early in the mid 60s but maintains his interest in the club today.

Paul was also a great administrator and served as Secretary for 12 years. We are extremely fortunate today in that field with Alison and we were then with Paul, who devoted huge amounts of his spare time to the Club. If that was not sufficient he also was a member of the Main Committee. It was at this time 1948 that the future of the Club was determined in that Brentham ceased to be The Institute and became Brentham Club Ltd. The Estate was being broken up and the Freeholders did not want to continue the ownership and running of the estate facility. It became a private club and the freehold was acquired at what was then a substantial figure, a huge decision but a forward thinking one. Without the leadership of Frank Ahl, the then Chairman, and the support given to him by Paul Swann Brentham would probably not be what it is today.

Happy birthday Paul and thank you for your efforts on our behalf.

Obituaries

SIMON HUNT **1962 -2014**

Simon started with the Club in 1974 and was another example of a young player being brought through from The Colts. He played through into the early 1990s and was dedicated Club man. He had a reputation as a gentle and lovely person, an asset to the life of the Club. After a constant battle with illness in recent years Simon passed away after suffering a burst stomach ulcer at the unconscionably young age of 52.

He played most of his cricket in the 2nd and 3rd XIs, and whilst he bowled medium pace occasionally, he was principally a batsman like his brother Robert. He was more than capable and this was underlined by the centuries he scored for both XIs. It was also suggested that he preferred, when not batting, to rest in the outfield!

His 1st XI career comprised some 50 matches the majority of which came in the mid-80s. He commendably averaged just over 20 with a highest score of 68, as well as 60 against the rated Beddington. In this he followed the family 1st XI trait as Robert his father was an outstanding opening swing bowler and his brother, also Robert, became a solid opening batsman.

Simon also played football for Brentham, beginning in the 5th XI in central midfield before his silky passing ability saw him advance through the sides to a regular place in the Reserves. In the early 90s he took on the responsibility as Chairman of the Section for a spell.

Simon married July in 1992 which brought a move to Hemel Hempstead. Although this curtailed his cricketing career it did bring him 3 daughters, Victoria, Amy and Emma.

KEN DRANE

1931 - 2013

The death of Ken on April 25th 2013 just 2 years after that of his wife Jean, after a mercifully short battle with cancer came as a great loss to all his family and friends. It was only on 15th February he attended, as he usually did, the Brentham Cricket Club Annual Dinner and little was it known that he would soon be taken from us. The messages vouching as to his character and standing have come from all around. He was held in high esteem by people of all generations and he has been described as a gentleman, a legend, and most of all selfless. He was a modest man who quietly got on and did things and mainly for others.

He came to Brentham C. C. in the mid-60s and renewed his association with David Vincent and Brian Mead who were at Ealing Grammar together. His cricketing career had passed its peak and he mainly played for the 2nd and 3rd Teams as he was faced with extreme competition for a place in the 1st XI. Nevertheless, he was picked to play quite a number of times as his attitude as well as his ability was always appreciated. He gave his all to everything he did and was a team player in the true sense of the word. His one failing was that he could radiate much nervousness when games got tight and it was not unusual, amidst much hilarity, for him to be despatched to the other side of the ground until the game played out.

Ken was predominately a consistent medium paced inswing bowler-hence Plugger as his nickname- but was more than able as a batsman to hold an end if necessary. Unfortunately, his playing statistics are not available but he came to the club with a high reputation from GWR, where he would have played the best of his cricket. His best figures for the 1st XI were 5 wickets for 32 runs off 14 overs, a splendid return, which underlined his ability. He did once achieve a half century with the bat and that memorably was on his 50th birthday. It merited the performance of "Alouette", his somewhat surprising but famous rendition on suitable social occasions.

Ken in addition to his playing performances fulfilled many roles that it was almost bewildering as to how he did it all-not that most people would be aware of it. In 1976 he took on the captaincy of the 3rd Team and continued until 1982. It was maybe here that the foundations were laid of what was to come. In 1980 he added to his commitments the managing of the Colts under-17 Team and continued to do so until 1983. In 1994 he took on the

responsibility of running the entire Colts set up becoming Colts Administrator. This was to continue until 2012 - a period of over 30 years and even then he remained as Treasurer. This was an immense role to fulfil for the club and, even more so, for the stream of youngsters that flowed through the organisation over all those years. If that was not sufficient, he also held the post of Secretary to the South Area of Middlesex Colts Association from 1996 to 2008.

In 2004 Brentham CC appointed Ken as a Life Vice President, the highest accolade available to the Club and followed this in 2012 with a special presentation in recognition of all he had done for us. His was an outstanding record.

Hockey also filled a great part of Ken's life. He initially played for GWR as well as the Wayfarers, a summer touring side, which included an annual Easter Tour, on which he was a regular member of the party. He then joined Eastcote Hockey Club in the mid-1970s and continued to play until 1992 to the ripe old age of 61. Together with his fellow full back, Tony Antony they had a renowned combined playing age of over 120!

He captained the 4th Team in 1978 and then joined in 1981 a new side called 3AS, for whom he played 272 games and even managed 2 goals. This team proved to be a successful mix of youth and experience and covered a multitude of sins!

If all this was not enough, Ken was a keen bridge player and a member of Ealing Bridge Club from 1980. True to form he served as Chairman for seven years. He also in the 1990s joined The Middlesex County Bridge Association Committee, initially as Membership Secretary before becoming Honorary Secretary from 1997 to 2010 and after that Membership Secretary. Over the years he worked tirelessly for Middlesex and for over a decade was the Middlesex delegate to EBU Council.

Ken was an excellent bridge player and this was underlined when he captained the victorious Middlesex Team in the 2011/12 Home Counties League. In 2011 his efforts and achievements were recognised when he received the Dimmie Fleming Award.

With all that was going on in his sporting life Ken was very reticent towards his home life. It was well known that he worked for the Ministry of Defence

but little else. The fact that he was involved with the TSR2 and Tornados and rose to Director of Contracts, Avionics would have been known to very few. It was the same with his family. He did not reveal very much, although more has been discovered more recently. The eulogies of his children Chris, Sheila, and Heather only go to underline that he was as committed to his family as he was in his external activities.

Behind all the facts and figures lies a full sporting and administrative life full of experiences, anecdotes, triumphs, and no doubt failures. There are a wealth of recollections of events and personalities. Ken will, however, be remembered especially for all he did for others and the enjoyment that he gave and obtained of meeting so many people over the years in a sporting environment.

He was a great stalwart and will be much missed.

- Display high standards of behaviour
- Promote the positive aspects of Cricket e.g. fair play
- Encourage all participants to learn the Laws and rules and play within them, respecting the decisions of match officials
- Actively discourage unfair play, rule violations and arguing with match officials
- Recognise good performance not just match results
- Place the well-being and safety of Young People above the development of performance
- Ensure that activities are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the individual
- Respect Young People's opinions when making decisions about their participation in Cricket
- Not smoke, drink or use banned substances whilst actively working with Young People in the Club.
- Not provide Young People with alcohol when they are under the care of the Club
- Follow ECB guidelines set out in the "Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' and any other relevant guidelines issued
- Report any concerns in relation to a Young Person, following reporting procedures laid down by the ECB
- In addition to the above, all Club Officers and Appointed Volunteers will:
- Hold relevant qualifications and be covered by appropriate insurance

- Always work in an open environment (i.e. avoid private or unobserved situations and encourage an open environment)
- Inform Players and Parents of the requirements of Cricket
- Know and understand the ECB's 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children'.
